Last fall we had the first of these new games in Drumheller where they had 268 representatives show up with all the zones represented. They held Bocce, Carpet Bowling, Duplicate Bridge, Euchre, Floor Shuffleboard, Military Whist, and Snooker – a total of nine events. They were well run and Zone 3 did well by winning the greatest number of medals. Forty-two in total: 10 in activities listed above and 32 in writing and arts. Carolyn Always, our Board Secretary, and Bev were our big winners in creative writing and arts.

We held our annual Zone Winter Games in the fall. We held eleven activities with more than two hundred participants. Both Five Pin Bowling and Ice Curling had over fifty participants – well done Coordinators Yvonne Armstrong and Doug McIntyre. Each activity will qualify people for the upcoming Provincial Championships. The first to qualify were the curlers who travelled to Grande Prairie for the Provincials in February. We are sending four teams to this event. I want to thank all our Activity Coordinators for a job well done in organizing and running these eleven activities. We still have two to go, Cross Country Skiing and Alpine skiing – later on in February.

There will be no Spring Provincial Championships as no Zone picked it up. The next Provincials are the Summer Championships in Calgary (see page 8) and the Fall games in Grande Prairie, where they will hold Military Whist, Duplicate and Contract Bridge, Euchre, Carpet Bowling, Floor shuffleboard, Floor Curling, Cribbage, and Bocce. As you can see, we had a tremendously busy fall and we look forward to a busy summer especially with the Summer Games being held here this year.

ALBERTA PROVINCIAL SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS - CALGARY

Calgary 55+ (Zone 3) will hold the Summer Provincial Championships in Calgary on Thurs., August 10th and Fri., August 11th, 2017. Alberta 55 plus medals will be awarded to the first 3 in every event. We will start at 10:00 a.m. Thursday and plan to finish by 4:00 p.m. Friday. This way participants can drive in on Thursday and drive out by Friday afternoon. We will have a banquet Thursday evening to which all participants are invited.

Participants will mail in their registration form plus \$65.00 to our Registration Chairman, On August 10th participants will go to their competing venue to check in at least 30 minutes before the event starts. Medals will be presented at the conclusion of each competition at the venue. No shuttle buses will be provided. **The registration deadline is July 1, 2107.**

We invite all Alberta 55+ Zones to come to Calgary in August to enjoy some competition and fun and renew acquaintances.

The events are:

- 1. Badminton: M+W doubles in age groups 55. 60. 65, 70, 75, 80, 85. Extra event is Mixed all ages.
- 2. Cycling: M 20 km, W 10 km; ages 55,65,70, 75, 85. Open 55 Predicted 5km Thurs. and 10 km Friday.
- 3. Five Pin Bowling: Male +Female singles scratch in ages 55, 65, 75. Mixed team of 4 in 55, POA.
- 4. Golf: M+W gross singles in ages 55,65,75,85. Also, Calloway same ages.
- 5. Horseshoes: Open singles in ages 55, 65 in 4 different ringer classes.
- 6. Ice Hockey: Teams of 18 in ages 55,60,65,70,75. Finals on Sat., August, 12th.
- 7. Pickleball: Male + Female pairs in 55, 65,75,85. Extra event Mixed Pairs in 55,65, 75, 85.
- 8. Slopitch: Male teams of 14 in ages 55, 60, 65, 70, 75. Mixed Team in age 55. Women's 55 Team.
- 9. Swimming: Male + Female in ages 55, 60, 65, 70, 75, 80, 85 in max. of 4 events: 50 free, 100 free, 50 back, 100 back, 50 breast, 100 breast, 75 IM. Predicted Male + Female 200, Thursday and 200 on Friday. Extra event is the 4X25 relay.
- 10. Track and Field (Athletics): Male + Female in ages 55, 60, 65, 70, 75, 80, 85 in maximum of 4 events: 100, 200, 800, 1500 and 3000, javelin, discus, shot put, long jumps, Predicted Male and Female 800 Walk Thursday and 1500 Friday. Extra event is the Men's and Women's 4 X 100 relay.
- 11. Tennis: Male and Female doubles in ages 55, 70, 75, 80, 85. Extra event Mixed Doubles 55, 70.
