Message From the President



Greetings Calgary 55 plus members,

I'm pleased to report that Calgary 55 plus had a very successful year in 2023. Our 2023 membership grew to well over 700, continuing to make Calgary the largest Zone in Alberta. Thank you, Calgary 55 plus Directors, Activity Coordinators, Volunteers, and most of all Members, for your help and continued support. The Alberta 55 plus Summer Games were held this past August at Brooks and were a great success. Feedback from you has been wonderful.

Unfortunately, Alberta 55 plus was unsuccessful in securing a host community for the current Winter Provincial Games. To ensure that they were staged, it was decided to split the events amongst the 8 Provincial Zones. Calgary was awarded hockey and alpine skiing, both of which took place early in 2023, primarily due to facility availability. Over 600 participants competed in the

hockey tournament, and we extend a big thank you to Laura Lee Goetjen and Harvey Poon for their hard work in organizing a first-class event. Alpine Skiing, held at Nakiska, attracted skiers from all over Alberta, contributing to another successful event, thanks to Marg Smith and her team. The remaining Winter Games are now underway in various Alberta Zones with many Calgary members competing. All designated games serve as qualifiers for the Canada Games in Quebec City in August 2024. Unfortunately, Alberta 55 plus faces a similar challenge in securing a host for the 2024 Winter Games. However, rest assured these events will proceed. Winter Games pose unique challenges in staging, as securing adequate facilities proves difficult with leagues securing the majority of ice and/or space for their activities. Additionally, most rural communities are unable to meet the needs of a large Provincial event. I will provide further updates as information becomes available. Meanwhile, the Calgary 55 plus games and qualifiers will continue as scheduled.

The 2025 Summer Provincial Games are scheduled for Leduc in 2025 and I'm confident they will be very successful. Their committee is working very hard to provide us with another fun, competitive, and first-class event. Details are available on the website.

We are exploring additional ways to enhance our Zone 3 offerings and we value your input! Please feel free to share your thoughts on what you'd like to see.

Lastly, we are in desperate need of volunteers to help stage activities or serve on our Board. If you are able, please reach out and let us know.

PAST PRESIDENT

(approximately 4 hours per month)

- 1. Chairs Nominating Committee.
- 2. Conducts the Election of Officers.
- 3. Aids in the nominating process for Alberta 55 plus awards.

PRESIDENT

(approximately 30 hours per month)

- 1. Prepares the agenda for all meetings.
- 2. Provides leadership to the Calgary 55 plus Committees.
- 3. Attends all Alberta 55 plus Board Meetings.

VICE-PRESIDENT

(approximately 10 hours per month)

- 1. Assumes the President's duties in his/her absence.
- 2. Organizes bussing required for Provincial Games.
- 3. Coordinates the Annual General Meeting.

TREASURER

(approximately 15 hours per month)

- Maintains current and accurate records of all financial affairs.
- 2. Responsible for the payment of all invoices.
- Submits a completed annual return to Corporate Registry.

ACTIVITY DIRECTOR – SUMMER GAMES

(Approximately 30 hours per month)

- Works with the Activity Director Winter Games to coordinate the calendar.
- Recruits and manages Activity Coordinators for Summer Games.
- 3. Keeps the 'Rules of the Games' binder up to date.

ACTIVITY DIRECTOR – WINTER GAMES

(Approximately 30 hours per month)

- 1. Recruits Activity Coordinators for all Winter activities.
- 2. Works closely with Activity Coordinators and helps host workshops.
- 3. Ensures Activity Coordinators understand the rules of their activity.

ACTIVITY COORDINATOR

(approximately 20 hours per event)

- Works closely with the appropriate Activity Director Summer or Winter
- Receive calls from interested members when activities are advertised.
- 3. Obtains the set of rules from the appropriate Activity Director.

ZONE REGISTRATION COMMITTEE CHAIR

(approximately 10 hours per month)

- 1. Assist with distribution of playoff brochures.
- 2. Assist in recruitment of volunteers for zone registration.
- 3. Completes playoff results forms.

PUBLICITY DIRECTOR

- Issues periodic press releases to media (Facebook and/or Website).
- 2. Organize Annual Volunteer Luncheon.
- 3. Provides up to date report to all Calgary 55 plus Board meetings.

CASINO CHAIR

(approximately 20 hours per Casino event)

- 1. Provides direct liaison with Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission.
- 2. Organizes casino volunteers and provides casino scheduling.

2024 Alberta 55 plus Invitational Alpine Ski Race - Doug Kyle Memorial

Sponsored by the Calgary 55 plus Game Association

This event took place at Nakiska Ski Hill on February 6th and 7th, 2024. Coached by Scott Zahn and Claudio Berto of the Masters Ski Club of Alberta, the event attracted a total of 30 racers, comprised of 21 recreational and 9 masters participants. Among them, seven were women, including one competing as a master skier. It's worth noting that many of the recreational skiers are esteemed members of the senior Alpine Ski Club. Congratulations to all the medal winners for their remarkable performances!

Additionally, I'd like to acknowledge the two oldest participants, Paul, and Larry, aged 89, and Jack, aged 87. Also, a special mention to the extraordinary women aged 80+, Bertha Ann and Gail. Their achievements are truly inspiring!

A heartfelt thank you goes out to Rennie McDonald for generously volunteering for this event.

In terms of medal distribution, recreational medalists were recognized across various age categories, including Men/Women: 85+, 80+, 75+, 70+, 65+, and 55+.

Regarding timing, due to technical issues with the timers, the times were recorded from the 2nd run, and unfortunately, not all runs were timed. We greatly appreciate everyone's patience during the delays and reruns. Fortunately, the weather conditions were ideal with sunny skies, no wind, and a temperature of 0 degrees Celsius.

Why Is It Called the Doug Kyle Memorial?

Doug Kyle, a distinguished athlete, represented Canada in four Olympic Games in Track and Field. Despite not being a ski racer, he played a pivotal role as a Director of the Calgary 55 plus Games Association, instrumental in initiating the first Invitational Alberta Ski Race for Alberta 55 plus. He consistently supported and contributed to making this event an annual success since its inception. Additionally, he personally designed and procured the new ski medal, with hopes of presenting them at this year's race.

Tragically, Doug Kyle passed away suddenly in a motor vehicle accident at the age of 91 last summer. This race was held to honor his extensive years of support and contributions to this sport.
